

Safety: General Worksite Hazard Control Procedures

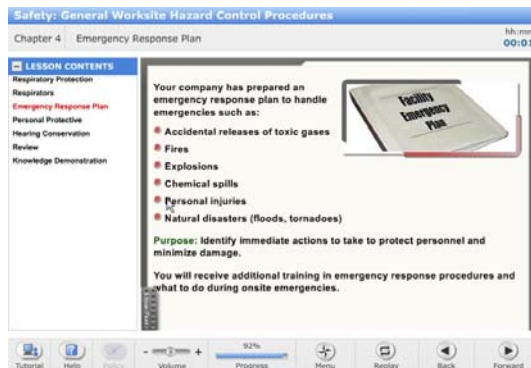
